Note: <sup>a)</sup> BURIAL: He was buried in Milton Cemetery, Portsmouth, Hants in 1934 in Plot D. Unfortunately, his grave was reclaimed in 1962 and now has someone else in it. This is because the grave was unpurchased, with no headstone. Portsmouth City Council policy is to automatically dig unpurchased graves 4 people deep, and release them for re-burial after 14 years. Harry was lucky that no-one joined him until 1962! The new internee would not have been a relative. OCCUPATION: Royal Navy, retired 9/12/1895. Copy of record held by DJF. Out in China Stations during his service, brought home Japanese miniature houses (bamboo & paper) also pair of shoes for his daughter Florence, when she was 2 yrs old. At the time of his daughter Florence's wedding in 1917, he was a storeman in HM Naval Base, Portsmouth.
