 British and French fleet entered the Baltic, and captured Bomarsund harbour and one of the Aland
 Islands (now part of Finland). Bomarsund is the sound between the islands and the Swedish island of
 Vardo; and at the fine harbour on Bomarsund, dominating the entrance of the Gulf of Bothnia, and
 indirectly that of the Gulf of Finland, the Russians had constructed a northern naval base, and this
 was destroyed in the attack. The British fleet taking part in the Baltic expedition comprised Her
 Majesty's ships Aeolus, Ajax, Alban, Algiers, Amphion, Archer, Arrogant, Basilisk, Belleisle, Blenheim,
 Boscawen, Bulldog, Caesar, Calcutta, Centaur, Colossus, Conflict, Cornwallis, Cossack, Cressy,
 Cruizer, Cuckoo, Cumberland, Dauntless, Desperate, Dragon, Driver, Duke of Wellington, Edinburgh,
 Esk, Euryalus, Exmouth, Falcon, Firefly, Geyser, Gladiator, Gorgon, Hannibal, Harrier, Hastings,
 Hawke, Hecla, Hogue, Imperieuse, James Watt, Leopard, Lightning, Locust, Magicienne, Majestic,
 Merlin, Miranda, Monarch, Neptune, Nile, Odin, Orion, Otter, Pembroke, Penelope, Pigmy, Porcupine,
 Prince Regent, Princess Royal, Pylades, Resistance, Retribution, Rhadamanthus, Rosamond, Royal

 the next B A 2, &c.; then follows the destination (a place or, more usually, a ship) and the date of
 dispatch. Most of the medals had been sent by the end of 1857.nnAlso the Crimean
 Medal.nSebastopol in the Crimea was the great Russian naval arsenal on the Black Sea. A combined
 assault by British, French and Turkish troops resulted in the reduction of Sebastopol and led to the
 Treaty of Paris of 27 April 1856, guaranteeing the independence of the Ottoman Empire. By
 Admiralty Order the Crimea Medal was awarded to sailors and marines present during the campaign,
 between 17 September 1854 (the first landing at Eupatoria) and 9 September 1855 (when the allies
 secured Sebastopol). Her Majesty's Ship Princess Royal, a 90-gun screw steamer, took part in the
 assault. Four clasps to this medal were awarded to the men present in the actions at Sebastopol
 itself, Inkerman, Balaklave (Balacalava) and (the sea of) Azoff. The Sea of Azoff (Azov, Azoph, Azof),
 east of the Crimean peninsula, is an arm of the Black Sea, with which it is united by the Straits of
 Kertch or Kaffa. This is the Azoff Clasp Roll, recording the names of the men from the ship who took
 part in the actions on the Azoff Sea during the Crimean War.nHis Crimean Medal was sent to the
 Littlehampton Coast Guard Station on 4th April 1857.nnBIOGRAPHY: Brighton Gazette - Thursday 07
 June 1860n THE GALE AT WORTHING. About seven o'clock on Saturday evening, the Plough, of
 Whitby, bound to Littlehampton, with 100 tons of stone for the Duke of Norfolk. Captain Johu
 Peacock, and a crew of two men and a boy, was driven in, and struck short distance from the shore
 at the eastern part of the town; the sea was running furiously, and the crew got into the boat, which
 was staved in getting her out. One of the men plugged the hole with piece of pork, which held a
 piece of sail down upon to keep out the water. The captain was standing at the bow, when sea broke
 over the boat and completely washed him out. When the man at the helm, with great presence of

mind, threw him an oar, which he was happily able grasp. He retained his hold thereof, though frequently submerged and lost to the view of the spectators and dashed about the breakers. He was in the water nearly twenty minutes, and as he neared the shore he appeared exhausted, and strong fears were entertained of his being able longer to retain the oar, when a coastguardsman of the name of Noster, of Lancing, fastening rope round his body, leaving the other end with the men shore, courageously rushed into the water and reached him just his last strength was failing him. Noster laid hold him, and for moment or two they both disappeared. Coming to the surface, the men on shore drew in the rope, and they were both got safe to land. The captain was conveyed to the Horse Shoes' Inn, at Lancing, and Dr. Sharpe was in attendance as speedily as possible. We are happy to state that the poor fellow soon rallied. The vessel has gone to pieces. A brig laden with coal was likewise driven on shore off Goring, and was expected to go to pieces. Several luggers were torn from their anchors in the roads and driven ashore, and more or less damaged; amongst them were the Lord Nelson, belonging to Mrs Beck, broken to pieces, the Elima, belonging to Mr G. Cortis and others, completely wrecked. The Caroline and the Long-Looked-for, both of Brighton, were considerably injured. Trees, chimney pots, and slates were displaced and thrown down; two very large trees in the south front of Warwick House were torn completely up, and in falling destroyed the branches of another; and one of the trees in the Steyne Gardens was blown one side against the iron railings and enclosure wall, doing it considerable injury.
