Funeral Delay in Hunt for Neice
Recluse cannot be laid to rest until beneficiary found.
An elderly Portsmouth recluse cannot be laid to rest until a mystery woman named in his will is found.
Wheelchair-bound Alexander Norster, aged 74, was found dead in his house at Grafton Street, Buckland, on October 22, after suffering heart failure.
And Portsmouth coroner David Thomas, co-ordinating the search for the woman, said the funeral will be postponed until the woman - cited as both executor and beneficiary - is located.
Mr Thomas said : "Mr Norster lived alone and didn't have much communication with anybody. Really he was a bit of a loner."
As far as we know he has no living relatives except this woman, named either Tracy or Julie Walters, who we know nothing about except that she lived at Harrow Road, in Southsea, a year ago. "We understand she could possibly be a neice. "We are anxious she should contact our office because she's a beneficiary of his will, as well as being the executor. "The will won't make her a millionaire but she'd certainly not be out of pocket if she came forward."
We are waiting to see if we can find her before any funeral arrangements are made but we can't wait forever.
If she doesn't come forward by the middle of next week the environmental health department will organise the funeral.
We're just hoping she's still living locally so it can all be sorted out soon.

He was on the last Ammunition Examiners Course prior to the war and served with the B.E.F. in France as an Ammunition Examiner in 1939 and 1940. Posted to India early in 1941, he served there until November 1944, when he returned to the U.K. before being posted to Norway with No. 9 Disarmament Team in July 1945, remaining there until that unit was disbanded in February 1947. He served subsequently in Malaya and Hong Kong, was awarded the L.S. & G.C. medal in 1955, and retired in 1958.
